## LAW INTERN, REMOVAL DEFENSE PROGRAMS

**POSITION DESCRIPTION:** Law interns for the Removal Defense Programs support PIRC's representation of clients facing deportation before immigration courts and the Board of Immigration Appeals (BIA).

## JOB PURPOSE AND ACTIVITIES:

- Supports representation of non-citizen adults facing deportation and detained at the Moshannon Valley Processing Center (MVPC), Clinton County Correctional Facility, or non-detained and residing in Pennsylvania. Cases include a wide scope of removal defense before immigration courts, the BIA, and the Third Circuit Court of Appeals. Cases selected under both a particular vulnerabilities model and a universal representation model.
- Assists with legal intakes and screenings of prospective clients for representation.
- Conducts research on legal issues relating to sufficiency of charges of removability, asylum eligibility, etc. Conducts relevant research on country conditions.
- Drafts Motions and/or Pre-Hearing Briefs in partnership with PIRC attorneys.
- Observes non-representational legal orientation services under the Legal Orientation Program to detained adults seeking to self-represent. Provides pro se assistance as appropriate with supervision.
- Regional travel required for detention visits on occasion; remote-hybrid schedule permitted.
- Performs in accordance with PIRC's Core Values of integrity, adaptability, innovation, empowerment, collaboration and diversity.
- Abides by all policies and procedures established by PIRC.

## QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE:

- Enrollment in an accredited law school and in good academic standing.
- Excellent research, writing, and oral advocacy skills.
- Effective communication and interpersonal skills. Ability to communicate with people of different racial, ethnic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds.
- Ethic of serving clients with compassion.
- Sense of personal initiative and ability to work independently with appropriate guidance and supervision.
- Ability to balance competing priorities and communicate as priorities shift. Ability to meet deadlines.
- Must be flexible and adaptable.
- Commitment to PIRC's mission, immigration advocacy, and legal services.
- Fluency (reading/writing/speaking) in Spanish and/or other language strongly preferred.
